- 1. <u>Welcome:</u> Clint welcomed everyone to the meeting, thanked them for coming and let them know what we would be covering today.
- 2. How are things? What can we help with? Amber Whatcott said that 5th grade teachers are doing a great job with their large classes. We are all hoping that we get 3 classes for 5th grade next year so the classes won't be so large. Clint talked about our 2 new interns for next school year. We talked about Ms. Hodson and Mr. Hogge who are interns this year and what a great job they are doing. Amber Whatcott really likes Ms.Hodson, her daughter is in that class. Everyone agrees that things are going well at Art City. The canned food drive went really well. We didn't have students pay for Val-O-Grams, they donated a can of food instead and it went really well. We liked it much better than when students also were able to pay money for Val-O-Grams.
- 3. Review Goals, Action Items and Budget for Reading Goal: By the end of 2024-25 the percent of students in grades 1-3 performing on grade level or making typical progress in reading will increase by 1%. Our plan is to hire technicians to provide early intervention and substitutes will be hired to provide teacher teams time to collaborate on literacy, curriculum maps, attend data meetings and participate in focused observations. We have budgeted \$46,500 for these things. The council concurs that hiring individuals to help with individuals is irreplaceable. This includes SST meetings, where teachers/admin decide what is and what isn't working for individual students.
- 4. Review Goals, Action Items and Budget for Math Goal: By the end of 2024-25 school year, the percent of students in grades 3-5 performing on grade level or

above in math will increase by 1%. We plan to purchase technology (chromebooks, headphones, etc), Substitutes will be hired to provide teacher teams time to collaborate on math content, curriculum maps, data meetings and participate in focused observations. Technicians will be hired to provide interventions and enrichment in mathematics. We have budgeted \$13,666. Clint mentioned that we will receive a little bit less than last year in funds. He will shave this off of technology instead of subs and technicians.

- 5. <u>Vote for Approval</u> Amber Whatcott asked someone to move to approve the budget proposal. Jamie Huston moved to approve, Marie Lindsey seconded and the rest of the council voted to approve.
- 6. Other items from council members: Next meeting will be the superintendents meeting on March 27th at SFHS from 4-5pm. We might need to hold a quick meeting in the future about our School Access Route. Clint is waiting to get it submitted with the feedback from council. Next meeting here at the school is April 18th at 12:30.
