1. Introductions and Welcome: Welcome. Talked about meeting with the superintendent in October. It was well attended. 3 new highschoools will be opening in the next 3 years. There will be an open house in May for Spanish Fork. Things are going well here at Art City. Parents seem happy, the council mentioned that there is not much negativity that they see. Clint asked if they had any concerns and no one had any about the school.
2. School Safety & Digital Citizenship: We are doing the following here at Art City to address these issues:
 - Mrs. Farr addresses online safety, etc. in her computer class. Clint will follow up with her on the specifics. Amber said 5th graders know about internet safety from Sheriece. She noticed this while she was tutoring in 5th grade.
 - PTA does internet safety during their Safety Week.
 - The district filters our content. Both teacher's and student's content is filtered, but student's content is filtered more than teacher's. Reports are sent to the school admin if there is inappropriate content that kids/teachers are trying to access.
 - Art City is asking teachers to not let students use chromebooks unsupervised.
 - We do a phone policy. We ask students to keep them in their backpacks during the school day.
3. Safe Walk Route: Clint showed a slide with the 4 different walking routes. He identified them all for the council so that we can decide how our access route is working. The council agreed that 200 North is a big concern. Crosswalk needs to be more visible. Back gate is also a concern because of random adults walking through during school hours. Clint assigned areas to student council members to watch and see how safe they are and we will discuss them in January.

4. Goal #1 and #2: Current Goals. Clint explained our current Trustland goals. Last year's reading goals were met. We are doing good things. Math goals were not met so we need to base our new goals off of those numbers. In January we will look at specific goals for next school year. Ashley asked Clint if funding is based on whether or not goals are met. Clint said no. Clint also added that he feels like you can never replace a trained person in intervention with technology, supplies, etc.

5. Items from Mr. Cornwall: Clint gave an update on the all-abilities swing. It has been ordered through the district, we are not sure when it will be installed. We were a little bit short from the fundraiser on the cost of the swing, PTA said they will donate \$1000 and we can get matching funds from the district to cover the rest of the cost.
